Twenty-four Wakatipu landowners were acknowledged by Deputy Prime Minister Hon Bill English for their contribution towards the 110+km Queenstown Trail at a special function at Amisfield Winery on Friday night. The landowners were presented with Certificates of Appreciation for providing easements in perpetuity over their land to open up previously inaccessible walking and cycling trails throughout the Wakatipu Basin. Trust chief executive Kaye Parker said the trust was fundraising for the final \$195,000 needed to complete the \$5.4 million trail and hopes the target will be reached in time for the October 18 official opening next month.
